



Local Healthwatch Financial Income 2014/15.

Local Healthwatch originally provided their income figures for 2014/15 to Healthwatch England through the online return in May/June 2014. Local Healthwatch were then provided another opportunity to confirm these figures in November. They show that across England there was only a 0.7% change in the total income for local Healthwatch which was £34.4m in 2014-15.

Due to the complexity of contracting arrangements it is not always possible for local Healthwatch to identify how much of their funding is to deliver their statutory activities as local Healthwatch and how much is for other activities they may be delivering such as the NHS complaints advocacy services.
